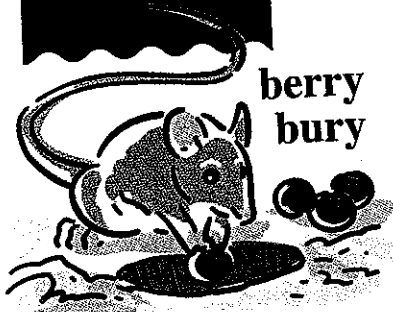

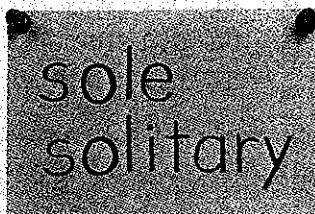

 ♦ These sound alike **lone, loan.**

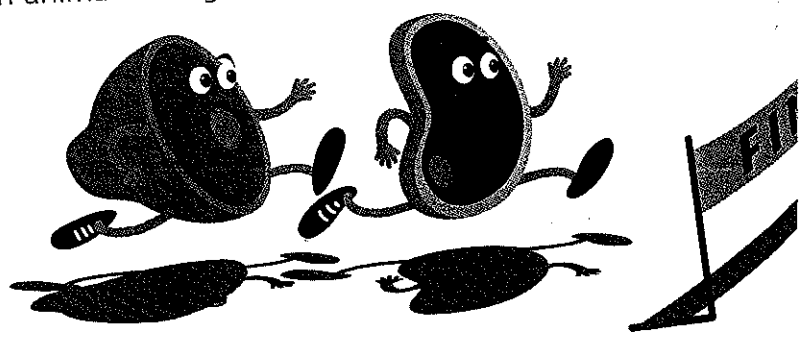




