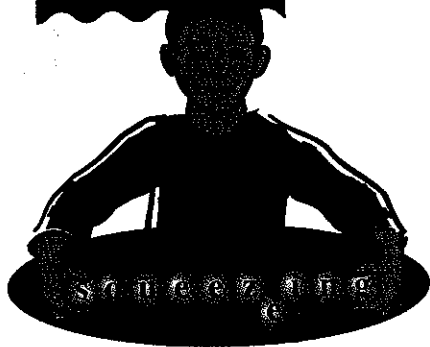

When a base word ends with *e*, you usually drop the *e* when *-ed* or *-ing* is added. If a base word does not end with *e*, you usually add the ending *-ed* or *-ing* without a spelling change.

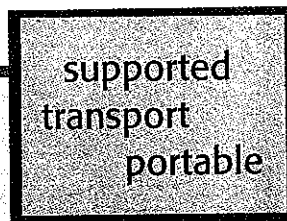

## Dictionary

**Base Words and Endings** A dictionary does not include an entry for every form of a word. To find a word that ends with *-ed*, *-ing*, *-er*, or *-est*, look up the base word. The word forms follow the part of speech.

**squeeze** [skwēz] *v.* squeezed, squeezing  
**warm** [wɔrm] *adj.* warmer, warmest
